

Project Name: **Ayres Farm House - Phase IB Interior Restoration**  
 Applicant: Ayres/Knuth Farm Foundation, Inc.  
 Location: Denville Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$149,040**



The c.1885 Ayres Farmhouse is located on the c.1803 Ayres-Knuth Farm Complex. The Ayres-Knuth Farm Complex is listed on the National Register and represents one of the most complete examples of a 19th C. Morris County agricultural complexes. The grant will provide for Phase I Interior Restoration including repair of interior finishes, windows and doors, and electrical upgrades.

Project Name: **Whippany Burying Yard - Tombstone Restoration**  
 Applicant: Hanover Township  
 Location: Hanover Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$39,859**



The first headstone at the Whippany Burying Ground was laid in 1718 and the cemetery includes veterans of the French and Indian War, Revolutionary War, War of 1812 and Civil War. The cemetery is individually listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide for stabilization and preservation of 13 gravestones from the 18th and 19th century.

Project Name: **Hartley Dodge Memorial - Entry and Plaza Restoration**  
 Applicant: Madison Borough  
 Location: Madison Boro.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$265,250**



The 1933 Harley Dodge Memorial was designed in the Neoclassical style by Richard S. Shapter and serves as the Madison Borough Hall. The building is contributing to the Madison Civic Historic District listed on the New Jersey and National Registers. The grant will provide for restoration of the entry and plaza, including the resetting and coating of granite pavers and the repair of stairs.

Project Name: **Museum of Early Trades & Crafts - Phase 4 Construction**  
 Applicant: Museum of Early Trades & Crafts  
 Location: Madison Boro.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$280,401**



The 1900 Richardsonian Romanesque building, originally constructed as the Madison Public Library, is individually listed on the NJ Register and contributes to a National Register historic district. It is home to the Museum of Early Trades & Crafts for over 47 years. The grant will provide for Phase 4 exterior preservation, including masonry repointing and replacement of the remaining slate roof.



Project Name: **Acorn Hall - Phase IIB Exterior Restoration**  
 Applicant: Morris County Historical Society  
 Location: Morristown Town  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$111,766**



Acorn Hall was constructed as an Italianate residence in 1853 and expanded in 1860. The building is individually listed on the National and New Jersey Registers and is locally registered. The grant will provide for exterior restoration including foundation stabilization, wood Italianate element restoration, tower re-roofing, and painting to restore 1860s-1880s appearance.

Project Name: **Church of the Assumption - Rear Roof Restoration**  
 Applicant: Church of the Assumption

 Grant Amount: **\$140,000**



The Church of the Assumption was founded in 1848 as the first Catholic Church in Morristown. The Church Building (1872) and Rectory (1890) were constructed in the High Victorian Gothic style and the Ministry Center (c. 1870) was constructed in the Stick style. The church complex contributes to a Register-listed Historic District. The grant will provide for restoration of the Church Building's rear roof.

Project Name: **Loyola Gate House - Roof and Gate Rehabilitation**  
 Applicant: Loyola House of Retreats  
 Location: Morristown Town  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$170,080**



The 3-bay wide, stuccoed gatehouse to the Spring Brook House was constructed in 1904-1906 and includes a dramatic, concave, flared mansard roof. The property is included in the 1986 Morristown Multiple Resource National Register Nomination, with the gatehouse contributing to the property. The grant will provide for building rehabilitation, including structural upgrades to the first floor.

Project Name: **South Street Presbyterian Church - Phase IIC Exterior Restoration**  
 Applicant: Presbyterian Church in Morristown  
 Location: Morristown Town  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$283,560**



The Parish House, built in 1878 as the South Street Presbyterian Church, was designed by the architect J. Cleveland Cady. The one-and-a-half story brownstone building with a dominant 3-story tower contributes to the Morristown Historic District, listed on the Historic Registers. The grant will provide for Exterior Restoration including the replacement of the bell tower roof.

Project Name: **Woman's Club of Morristown - Interior Storm Windows**  
 Applicant: The Woman's Club of Morristown, Inc.  
 Location: Morristown Town  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$2,746**



The 1797 Federal style building was originally built as the home of Dr. Lewis Condict, with later additions in 1918 and 1919, and now serves as the home of the Woman’s Club of Morristown. The building is individually listed on both the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide for the design and installation of interior storm windows for sidelights and transom at main entrance.

Project Name: **Seward House - Phase I Exterior Restoration**  
 Applicant: Mount Olive Township  
 Location: Mount Olive Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$195,960**



The Seward House, an Italianate style farmhouse constructed c. 1800 with an 1860 addition, currently sits on 270 acres of park land and is unoccupied. The building is listed on both the National and New Jersey Registers. This grant will provide for Phase 1 Exterior Restoration including structural reinforcement of framing, restoration of slate roof, chimneys, cupola and cornices.

Project Name: **St. Peter's Mountain Lakes - Roof Replacement**  
 Applicant: St. Peter's Mountain Lakes  
 Location: Mountain Lakes Boro.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$261,848**



The Gothic Revival church was erected in 1926 with a Parish Hall added in 1955. The Rectory is a Hapgood residence constructed with Craftsman style influences in 1916. All buildings are contributing resources in the Mountain Lakes National Register Historic District. The grant will provide for replacement of the church building slate roofing and replacement of the storm water drainage system.

Project Name: **Growing Stage - Structural Upgrades**  
 Applicant: Growing Stage - The Children's Theatre of New Jersey  
 Location: Netcong Boro.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$148,080**



Built in 1919 as the Palace Theatre, the building is currently utilized as the Growing Stage - Children's Theatre of New Jersey. The building is individually listed on the Historic Registers, and shows evolution of American entertainment industry from live stage productions to film. The grant will provide for structural upgrades of roof framing, roof replacement and lighting and awnings installation.



Project Name: **Smith-Baldwin House - Exterior Rehabilitation**  
 Applicant: Parsippany-Troy Hills Township  
 Location: Parsippany-Troy Hills Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$222,449**



The early 19th century Federal and Greek Revival house contributes to the Troy Historic District and its additions reflect the development of the village. The National Register designation is pending review. The grant will provide for exterior rehabilitation including removal of aluminum siding, restoration of underlying wood siding, restoration and selective replacement of windows, structural repairs.

Project Name: **King Homestead Museum - Exterior Rehabilitation**

The c. 1815 former store and post office is two and a half stories in height. The 1881 Queen Anne style residence was constructed for Theodore F. King from his store's proceeds. The buildings are contributing to the Ledgewood Historic Park and Drakesville Historic District and listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide for exterior rehabilitation of windows and doors.

Project Name: **Lake Hopatcong Train Station - Interior Rehabilitation**  
 Applicant: Lake Hopatcong Foundation  
 Location: Roxbury Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$160,000**



This 1911 train station is in the Jacobean style. Train passengers could transfer to steamboats connecting to the Morris Canal, or take the trolley to Bertrand Island Park. The building is included in the 2016 Morris Canal Historic District Boundary Increase National Register Historic District. The grant will provide for the rehabilitation of interior rooms and the restoration of windows.

Project Name: **Ledgewood Baptist Church - Bell Tower Restoration**  
 Applicant: Ledgewood Baptist Church

 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$120,000**



The Ledgewood Baptist Church was constructed in 1917 in the Gothic Revival style by the Gallo Brothers. The cobblestone-faced building uses poured-in-place, steel-reinforced construction, a new building technology in the early 1900s. It is a contributing resource in the New Jersey Register's Ledgewood Historic District. The grant will provide for bell tower restoration and selective roof replacement.

Project Name: **Union School House - Exterior Restoration**  
 Applicant: Washington Township Historical Society  
 Location: Washington Twp.  
 Grant Type: Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$58,308**



The c. 1830 Union School House was built using German masonry techniques and included a school room on the second floor and a meeting space on the first floor. The building currently houses the Historical Society and is listed on both the New Jersey and National Registers. The grant will provide for exterior restoration including window, doors, woodwork, porches and chimney repairs.

Project Name: **Dr. Condict House - Preservation Plan**  
 Applicant: Dover Area Historical Society  
 Location: Dover Town  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$10,800**



The Dr. Condict House, also known as the Presbyterian Church House, was constructed c. 1890 in the Queen Anne style and represents one of the remaining homes known as Doctor's Row on Blackwell Street. The building is a Key Contributing resource in the Blackwell Street Historic District. The grant will provide for the completion of a Preservation Plan for the house.

Project Name: **L'Ecole Kinnelon Museum - Construction Documents**

L'Ecole Dr. Helen Miller Residence and Office was constructed in 1873 to serve as a one-room schoolhouse. The building was used as the Town Hall before becoming the home and office of Dr. Helen Miller, an early pioneer in female cancer detection and screening, in the 1930s. This grant will provide for completion of Construction Documents related to interior finishes, MEP systems.

Project Name: **Woman's Club of Morristown - Construction Documents**  
 Applicant: The Woman's Club of Morristown, Inc.  
 Location: Morristown Town  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$5,000**



The 1797 Federal style building was originally built as the home of Dr. Lewis Condict, with later additions in 1918 and 1919, and now serves as the home of the Woman's Club of Morristown. The building is individually listed on both the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide for completion of Construction Documents related to roof and windows replacement.

Project Name: **Community Church of Mountain Lakes - Construction Documents**  
 Applicant: Community Church of Mountain Lakes  
 Location: Mountain Lakes Boro.  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$19,840**



The Church was constructed in 1913 by the congregation on land donated by Hapgood, and was later expanded in 1926. The Chapel and education wing were added in 1957. The building is a contributing resource in the Mountain Lakes National Register Historic District. The grant will provide for Construction Documents related to the repair of cement stucco coating.

Project Name: **Martin Berry House - Construction Documents**  
 Applicant: Pequannock Township  
 Location: Pequannock Twp.  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$52,000**



The c. 1740 Dutch Colonial house includes a gambrel roof, shallow fireplaces, interior chimneys, thick stone walls and massive roof framing. The house was documented through the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) in 1939. The house was listed on the National Register in 1973. The grant will provide for completion of Construction Documents related to sitework, building restoration.

Project Name: **Fox's Brook Culvert - Construction Documents**  
 Applicant: Rockaway Borough  
 Location: Rockaway Boro.  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$22,400**



The c. 1826 culvert was constructed as part of the Morris Canal system, transporting canals over Fox's Brook. Today, it carries a roadway across Fox's Brook. The culvert is a contributing structure in the Morris Canal National Register Historic District. The grant will provide for completion of Construction Documents related to stabilization of the stone culvert, drainage and landscape improvements.

Project Name: **Zion Lutheran Church - Preservation Plan**  
 Applicant: Zion Lutheran Church  
 Location: Washington Twp.  
 Grant Type: Non-Construction  
 Grant Amount: **\$27,760**



The 1832 Zion Lutheran Church was constructed in the Gothic Revival Style. Subsequent additions included the addition of the narthex and steeple and sanctuary enlargement in 1861. The property is identified as a Key Contributing resource in the German Valley National Register Historic District. The grant will provide for completion of a Preservation Plan for the building.



Project Name: **Morris Canal Lock 2 East - Construction Administration**  
Applicant: Wharton Borough  
Location: Wharton Boro.  
Grant Type: Non-Construction  
Grant Amount: **\$38,790**



The Morris Canal Incline Lock 2 East and associated Tender's House and outbuildings are an integral part of the 19th century Morris Canal system. The lock and related buildings contribute to the Morris Canal Historic District, listed on the Historic Registers. The grant will provide for Construction Administration for the restoration of Lock and stabilization of tender's house.

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
