

Project Name: **Boonton Holmes Public Library - Exterior Restoration**
 Applicant: Boonton Town
 Location: Boonton Town
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$161,904**



The building was constructed c. 1849. It was converted into the Boonton Holmes Public Library after 1870. Individually listed on the Historic Registers, it is a contributing resource to the Boonton Historic District. The grant will assist with exterior restoration to include new wood windows to match the library's early 20th C. appearance at the 1st, 2nd and 3rd floors, and repair of existing doors.

Project Name: **Whippany Burying Yard - Tombstone Restoration**
 Applicant: Hanover Township
 Location: Hanover Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$18,320**



The first headstone at the Whippany Burying Yard was laid in 1718 and the cemetery includes veterans of the French and Indian War, Revolutionary War, War of 1812 and Civil War. It is individually listed on the New Jersey Register. The grant will provide for stabilization and preservation of eighteen 18th and 19th C. gravestones. This would have addressed all the stones in the Preservation Plan.

Project Name: **L'Ecole Kinnelon Museum - Interior Rehabilitation**
 Applicant: Kinnelon Borough
 Location: Kinnelon Boro.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$187,560**



L'Ecole The Dr. Helen Miller Residence and Office was constructed in 1873 to serve as a one-room schoolhouse. The building was used as the Town Hall before becoming the home and office of Dr. Helen Miller, an early pioneer in female cancer detection and screening, in the 1930s. The building is listed on the NJ Register. The grant will assist with interior rehabilitation including utility upgrades.

Project Name: **Bridget Smith House - Interior Restoration**
 Applicant: Mine Hill Township
 Location: Mine Hill Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$57,640**



The Bridget Smith House is one of the last remaining unmodified mine workers' dwellings typical of the mid-1800s, and is individually listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The Township had completed utilities and structural repairs grant projects. The grant will assist with repointing of interior masonry, and reproduction of historic wallpaper in the main period spaces on the 1st and 2nd floors..

Project Name: **Woman's Club of Morristown - Partial Roof Replacement**
 Applicant: The Woman's Club of Morristown, Inc.
 Location: Morristown Town
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$57,880**



The 1797 Federal style building was originally built as the home of Dr. Lewis Condict, who was a local and state politician instrumental in shaping Morris County and New Jersey in the late-18th and early-19th C. The building now serves as the home of the Woman’s Club of Morristown. The building is individually listed on the Historic Registers. The grant will assist with partial roof replacement.

Project Name: **Seward House - Phase II Exterior Restoration**
 Applicant: Mount Olive Township
 Location: Mount Olive Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$195,960**



The Seward House, an Italianate style farmhouse constructed c. 1800 with an 1860 addition, currently sits on 270 acres of park land and is unoccupied. The building is individually listed on the National and NJ Register of Historic Places. The grant will provide for Phase II Exterior Restoration including cupola, cornices, masonry chimneys, slate roof, structural reinforcement of floor and roof framing.

Project Name: **Craftsman Farms Administration Building - Rehabilitation**
 Applicant: The Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms, Inc.
 Location: Parsippany-Troy Hills Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$355,143**



The 1911 Administration Building was originally a garage that supported the 650-acre property owned by Gustav Stickley, a leader in the American Arts and Crafts movement. A contributing building to the National Historic Landmark. The Administration Building was remodeled after a c. 1950 fire. The grant will assist with the rehabilitation of the ground floor, including restoration of window, interior plaster, and new steel structure.

Project Name: **Smith-Baldwin House - Phase 2 Rehabilitation**
 Applicant: Parsippany-Troy Hills Township
 Location: Parsippany-Troy Hills Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$258,064**



The early 19th century Federal and Greek Revival house is a contributing resource in the Troy Historic District and its additions reflect the development of the village. The Township will start soon on Phase 1 exterior rehabilitation project (2017 grant). The grant will provide for Phase 2 Exterior Rehabilitation including restoration of woodwork, doors, windows, porch and structural repairs, new barrier-free lift.



Project Name: **Martin Berry House - Rehabilitation**
 Applicant: Pequannock Township
 Location: Pequannock Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$281,728**



The c. 1740 Dutch Colonial house includes a gambrel roof, shallow fireplaces, interior chimneys, thick stone walls and massive roof framing. The house was documented through the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) in 1939. The house was listed on the National Register in 1973. The grant will provide for exterior and interior rehabilitation including site work, new barrier-free ramp, electrical upgrade.

Project Name: **Fox's Brook Culvert - Fox's Brook Culvert**
 Applicant: Rockaway Borough
 Location: Rockaway Boro.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$141,450**



The c. 1826 culvert was constructed as part of the Morris Canal system, transporting canals over Fox's Brook. Today, the surface of the arched structure is paved, and used as a roadway. The culvert is a contributing structure to the Morris Canal National Register Historic District. The grant will assist with stabilization and restoration, replacement of fallen stones, grading and landscaping.

Project Name: **King Homestead Museum - Stone Wall Extension**
 Applicant: Roxbury Historic Trust, Inc.
 Location: Roxbury Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$89,920**



The c. 1815 former store and post office is two and a half stories in height. The 1881 Queen Anne style residence was constructed for Theodore F. King from the proceeds from his store. The buildings are contributing in the Ledgewood Historic Park and Drakesville Historic District and listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will assist with the stabilization and rebuilding of a stone wall.

Project Name: **Lake Hopatcong Train Station - Interior / Exterior**
 Applicant: Lake Hopatcong Foundation
 Location: Roxbury Twp.
 Grant Type: Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$180,000**



This 1911 train station was designed in the Jacobean style as part of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad and the Lackawanna Cutoff project. 3 forms of transportation was directly accessible from the station: rail, steamboat and trolley. Built with rubble stone with glazed terra cotta detailing. The grant will provide interior rehabilitation including waiting room, vestibule and baggage room, benches and doors.

Project Name: **Stone Arched Bridge - Conditions Assessment**
Applicant: Boonton Town
Location: Boonton Town
Grant Type: Non-Construction
Grant Amount: **\$22,720**



The 1866 Stone Arched Bridge served as a viaduct to provide fire protection for the Boonton Ironworks. The Arched Bridge is the only intact portion of the ironworks remaining. It now functions as a walking bridge and overlook for the Boonton waterfalls and is the only connection across the Rockaway River from the Grace Lord Park to the ironworks. The grant will assist with preparation of a Conditions Assessment.

Project Name: **Ayres Farm Tenant House - Construction Documents**
Applicant: Ayres/Knuth Farm Foundation, Inc.
Location: Denville Twp.
Grant Type: Non-Construction
Grant Amount: **\$22,200**



The c. 1885 Ayers Farmhouse is located on the c. 1803 Ayres-Knuth Farm Complex. The Farm Complex represents one of the most complete examples of a 19th century Morris County agricultural complexes. The Tenant House is a worker's cottage built for immigrants in the late 19th C. The grant will assist with preparation of Construction Documents for exterior and interior restoration.

Project Name: **Hancock Cemetery - Preservation Plan**
Applicant: Florham Park Borough
Location: Florham Park Boro.
Grant Type: Non-Construction
Grant Amount: **\$7,140**



The earliest grave marker dates to 1781. The cemetery is associated with Rev. John Hancock (1776-1854), a father of Methodism and a member of the NJ Legislature. The cemetery has been used as a public burial place. The cemetery is individually listed on the National and NJ registers. The grant will provide for the preparation of a Preservation Plan including treatment recommendations for individual markers.

Project Name: **Mead Hall - Preservation Plan**
Applicant: Drew University
Location: Madison Boro.
Grant Type: Non-Construction
Grant Amount: **\$26,268**



The 1833 administration building on the campus of Drew University was originally built as a residence for William Gibbons and his family. Mead Hall is considered one of the finest examples of Greek Revival architecture north of the Mason-Dixon Line. The building was restored in the 1990s after a fire. Mead Hall is listed individually on the Historic Registers. The grant will assist with preparation of a Preservation Plan.

Project Name: **Bridget Smith House - Construction Documents**
 Applicant: Mine Hill Township
 Location: Mine Hill Twp.
 Grant Type: Non-Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$9,600**



The Bridget Smith House is one of the last remaining unmodified mine workers' dwellings typical of the mid-1800s, and is individually listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide the preparation of Construction Documents for exterior restoration to include restoration of siding, windows, doors, painting, barrier-free access, and restoration of the Well House.

Project Name: **Acorn Hall Carriage House - Construction Documents**
 Applicant: Morris County Historical Society
 Location: Morristown Town
 Grant Type: Non-Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$10,320**



Acorn Hall was constructed as an Italianate residence in 1853 and expanded in 1860. The building is individually listed on the National and New Jersey Registers. The Carriage House is representative of a mid-19th C., upper middle-class, utilitarian carriage house. The grant will provide for the preparation of Construction Documents for roof restoration and stabilization of building structure.

Project Name: **Friends Meeting House - Preservation Plan**
 Applicant: Friends Meeting House & Cemetery Association of Randolph
 Location: Randolph Twp.
 Grant Type: Non-Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$24,080**



The 1758 meeting house is purported to be the oldest hand-hewn building in Morris County and the best preserved framed, wood-pegged construction Quaker meeting house in its original condition in the nation. The building is individually listed on the Historic Registers. The building is currently open to public tours and used as the association headquarters. The grant will assist with the preparation of a Preservation Plan.

Project Name: **Union School House - Construction Documents**
 Applicant: Washington Township Historical Society
 Location: Washington Twp.
 Grant Type: Non-Construction
 Grant Amount: **\$5,994**



The c. 1830 Union School House was built using German masonry techniques and included a school room on the second floor and a meeting space on the first floor. The building currently houses the Historical Society and is listed on both the New Jersey and National Registers. The grant will assist with preparation of Construction Documents for roof replacement with cedar shakes and chimney restoration.

Project Name: **Morris Canal Lock 2 East - Construction Administration**
Applicant: Wharton Borough
Location: Wharton Boro.
Grant Type: Non-Construction
Grant Amount: **\$38,250**



The Morris Canal Incline Lock 2 East and associated Tender's House and outbuildings are an integral part of the 19th century Morris Canal system. The lock and related buildings are contributing features in the Morris Canal Historic District, listed on both the National and New Jersey Registers. The grant will provide for Construction Administration to facilitate the restoration of the lock and tenders house.
